1 Objective

The objective of these Regulations is to prescribe matters for the purposes of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004**.

2 Authorising provision

These Regulations are made under section 35 of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004**.

3 Commencement

These Regulations come into operation on 1 July 2006.

4 Corresponding laws

For the purposes of the definition of *corresponding law* in section 3 of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004**, a law specified in column 2 of the Schedule of a jurisdiction specified opposite that law in column 1 of the Schedule is declared to be a law of that jurisdiction that corresponds to that Act.

5 Prescribed members of the staff of the Office of Police Integrity

For the purposes of paragraph (b) of the definition of *prescribed member of staff of the Office of Police Integrity* in section 3 of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004**, the following positions and classes of employees are prescribed—

- (a) the position of Deputy Director, Police Integrity;
- (b) the position of Assistant Director, Police Integrity;
- (c) employees in the Office of Police Integrity classified as non-executive employees Grade 4, 5 or 6 or Senior Technical Specialist.

6 Law enforcement officers appointed as supervisors

For the purposes of section 5(4)(c) of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004**, the following classes are prescribed—

- (a) employees in the Office of Police Integrity classified as Executive Officer; or
- (b) employees in the Office of Police Integrity classified as non-executive employees Grade 6 or Senior Technical Specialist.

7 Senior law enforcement officers in the Office of Police Integrity

For the purposes of paragraph (c) of the definition of *senior officer* in section 34(5) of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004** the following positions are prescribed—

- (a) the position of Deputy Director, Police Integrity;
 - (b) the position of Assistant Director, Police Integrity.

The Crimes (Assumed Identities) Regulations 2006, S.R. No. 74/2006 were made on 27 June 2006 by the Governor in Council under section 35 of the **Crimes (Assumed Identities) Act 2004**, No. 15/2004 and came into operation on 1 July 2006: regulation 3.

The Crimes (Assumed Identities) Regulations 2006 will sunset 10 years after the day of making on 27 June 2016 (see section 5 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**).
