The Magistrates' Court (Arbitration) Regulations 2010, S.R. No. 43/2010 were made on 23 June 2010 by the Lieutenant-Governor, as the Governor's Deputy, with the advice of the Executive Council under section 140 of the **Magistrates' Court Act 1989**, No. 51/1989 and came into operation on 26 June 2010: regulation 3.

The Magistrates' Court (Arbitration) Regulations 2010 will sunset 10 years after the day of making on 23 June 2020 (see section 5 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**).
